



INTRODUCTION TO GRADE INFLATION

WHAT IS GRADE INFLATION?



Definition of Grade Inflation

Grade inflation means giving higher grades than earned, misrepresenting students' true abilities and knowledge.

Causes of Grade Inflation

Grade inflation happens intentionally to avoid complaints or unintentionally due to inconsistent grading standards.

Impact on Academic Integrity

Inflated grades undermine academic integrity, reduce credential value, and distort true student performance.

Need for Awareness and Action

Recognizing grade inflation helps educators uphold fairness and maintain high academic standards.

COMMON SCENARIOS

Uniform Perfect Scores

Awarding perfect scores to all students removes differentiation and undermines assessment integrity.

Favoritism in Grading

Giving higher grades based on personal favoritism compromises fairness and biases results.

Inflating grades to avoid complaints fosters entitlement and lowers academic standards.

Impact on Educators

Grade inflation hinders teachers from accurately assessing student understanding and identifying learning gaps.

Professional Reputation Risk

Student Growth Hindrance

Inflated grades prevent students from receiving constructive feedback necessary for academic improvement.

Avoiding grade inflation is essential for maintaining trust, accountability, and educational quality.

Tracking Student Progress



Monitoring assignments and quizzes allows timely interventions to support struggling students effectively.
